About this Guide

This guide has been lovingly put together by teachers in the Earlybird network.

It is intended to provide easy-to-implement activity ideas in order to facilitate ongoing learning and development for children missing out on having these opportunities due to the mandated school-closure period.

We aim to release new guides every Friday on a weekly basis during the school-closure period.

This guide includes two activities for each day of the week for your 3 - 4 year old:

A HANDS-ON STEM ACTIVITY - aimed at encouraging curiosity, building, experimentation, reasoning and foundational mathematical skills.

A CREATIVE EXPRESSION ACTIVITY - providing daily opportunities for self-expression through music, movement, speech, imaginary play, and crafts.

These more-or-less follow the three teacher-led activity periods during our daily routine for this age group. Each activity is aimed at supporting your child's progress in a particular "Objective for Development and Learning" or "ODI".

In addition to these hands-on STEM and creative expression activities, we recommend you read a story to your child every day and take them outside for some movement activities every day.

Activities should not take longer than 30-minutes to prep and 30-minutes to implement using items commonly found at home, in the grocery store or at a stationary shop.

Box Road

Position and Direction

ln brief Flatten an old cardboard box and use a black marker to create road outlines. With the help of your kids and some blocks and other toys, you can create your very own city (please build plenty of hospitals!)

ODL:

Musical instruments

In brief: Plastic dinner plates, cardboard, and elastic bands are all you need to build your own guitar with your kiddos. Let them decorate their own plates and encourage them to listen to guitar-based music and mimic the chords they hear.

Sorting Shapes

ODL:

Shape recognition/manipulation

In brief: Use an empty ice-tray to create a sorting game for your little one. Shapes, colours, numbers and letters are all good categories on which to get your child to practice their matching and sorting skills.

Musical instruments

In brief: Children love seeing their own names in writing. Give them the opportunity to decorate the letters of their name by creating large bubble letters on newspaper or brown paper and taping it somewhere where messy-play is allowed.

In brief Use the lid of a pizza box or a shoe box to create a series of numbered parking bays with a black marker. Add numbers to your child's toy cars or toy blocks and ask them to "park" the toys in their correct parking bays.

Coherent Expression

In brief: Dig out some old socks and scraps of material and wool and buttons and getting sewing and glueing and stapling with your child to create a sock puppet show for the rest of the family.

Building Bridges

ODL:

Position and direction

In brief Have your little ones build a series of bridges between cups using ice cream sticks or straws stuck together. Encourage them to test the strength of their bridges with various toy animals. Use position and directions words during the activity.

ODL:

Letter Recognition

In brief: Create a large cut-out of the first letter of your child's name and punch a series of holes in it.
Encourage your child to 'sew' some wool or other thread through as many of the punch holes as he/she can manage.

Shape recognition/manipulation

In brief: Use various shapes of cardboard to build a gingerbread house with your child. Encourage them to point out the corresponding shapes in your house at home.


Self-portrait

ODL:

Drawing and painting

In brief: Give your little one a hand mirror, some paper, and crayons and ask them to draw what they see. Guide them by getting them to describe each aspect of their face one-by-one before they begin drawing.

Comparing and critical thinking

In brief: Trace caps that all differ in size on a paper, mixed up instruct your child to place each cap where it belongs and fits perfectly.

Rainbow Colour Sorting

ODL:

Colour recognition and sorting

In brief: Copy or draw rainbow template on a sheet of paper, use colour paper that resembles rainbow as close as possible, instruct your child to only stick one colour shape per line having to search for individual colours before sticking and completing rainbow

Animal Measuring

ODL

Measurement skills

In brief: Collect a pile of pictures or toys of different sizes. Use building blocks to compare the lengths of these different objects and ask your comparative questions about these objects as they work.

Fantasy and exploratory play

In brief: Paint and decorate recycled tissue boxes to dramatically enlarge your child's tiny human feet to enormous animal paws. Play along with scenarios they come up with to accompany their new features.

Playdough and Pasta

Spacial awareness and concentrating

In brief Start with instructing your child to roll many round balls using the playdough, show physically how playdough ball and pasta can stand upright, challenge your child to stack this playdough ball and pasta technique

Sponge Stamp Surprise

ODL:

Creativity and Imaginative

In brief: Using recycled toilet rolls and sponges for stamp ask your child if you may create something with their help, colours picked get painted all over sponge, stamp and reveal your teamwork. Observe and give creative freedom to discover

Repeat patterning

In brief: Use marshmallows to create a basic pattern by dipping them in paint and stamping them on a page. one pattern per row only two colours at a time., repeat until no space left, if edible paint was used feel free to allow your child to have some messy play time.

Hide and Seek Matching Pairs

ODL:

Language and short-term recall

In brief: Collect a few objects found around your house in pairs. Hide one from each pair in a box with sand, oats, or rice. Hide the other somewhere around the house. Have your child dig for objects in the box and then search for their matching pair around the house.

Number Stick Stack

ODL:

Quantity correspondence and numeral recognition

In brief: Write the numbers 1 - 10 on individual cards and use playdough or prestick together with straws or sticks to set this activity up. Your child can use beads, buttons, cereal etc to count, stack and correctly represent each number they see.


Kitchen Monster Art

ODL:

Imagination

In brief: Use child-friendly kitchen utensils (such as spatulas, forks, potato mashers, sieves) and bowls of paint to create interesting stamps. When paint has dried use a marker to fill in monsters with limbs, let your child stick eyes for final touches.

Patchwork house

ODL:

Shape manipulation

In brief: Collect scrap pieces of material, buttons and glue. Cut out cardboard into the shape of a house. Then let your child decorate the house in his/her unique way. Using the old fabric materials, buttons and glue.

Mirror craft

ODL:

Fantasy Play

In brief: Cut the shape of a mirror out of a rigid piece of cardboard. Have your child cut a circle of tin foil and glue it onto the face of the cardboard 'mirror'. Encourage your child to decorate around the foil and paint their portrait on top of the foil.

Oil and Water

ODL:

Critical thinking

In brief Pour water into several cups. Pour oil into other cups and add food coloring to the oil (stir to combine). Have your child use a straw or a spoon to transfer droplets of coloured oil into the cups of water and explore the different densities.


Feelers

ODL:

Classification

In brief:

Trace your child's hand onto a piece of paper and then look around the house for items of different textures. Work with your child to cut the items out and glue them onto the paper hand. Ask your child to describe the different textures.

Problem Solving

In brief Fill a container with water and different-sized pompoms or sponges. Place an empty container next to it. Give your child a chance to squeeze the water out of the different-sized pompoms/sponges and to test which ones absorbed the most water.

Patterning

In brief: Cut an egg shape out of cardboard. Have your child help you cover the egg shape with tin foil and then give him/her kokis to decorate the egg with repeated patterns. Work with your child to describe the different kinds of repeated patterns you are creating.

ODL:

Vocabulary development

In brief Hide photos of different family members in a sensory bin. Take turns with your child to dig in and find a picture. Then tell a story about the family member(s) in the photo.

ODL:

Gross Motor Coordination

In brief: All you need is a torch, a music-player and a 'dance floor' area to pull off this activity. The whole family can play along! Each person should take a chance to dance 'in the spotlight', showing-off their different moves.

Number Sense

In brief Write the number '0' on a paper plate. Then place five paper clips on the plate and write the number '5'. Place another five paper clips and then write the number '10' and so on. Have your child count the clips with you and use their fingers to track each bunch of five.


Fork Tulips

ODL:

Creative Expression

In brief: Squeeze various colors of paint onto a piece of paper. Dip the backside of the fork in the paint, press down on the paper to make tulips impression, wipe the fork with paper towel. The child can use his or her fingers to add the stems in the flowers use the fork to make grass





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


Colour matching and counting

DL: Reasoning


In brief: Using a piece of paper, draw 4 columns. Using crayons or coloured markers make a coloured circle. (Red, Brown, Yellow and Green) Let your child go outside into the garden or around the house to look for items of the same colour. Let them put the objects they found in the column that matches its colour, then they must count how many objects each column has.

Pasta necklaces

ODL:

Hand Eye Coordination

In brief: Allow your child to use food colouring and dry pasta to make a pasta necklace with string. Let the children dip the pasta into the food colouring to colour it and once dry, let then slide the pasta onto the string to make their necklaces.

Walking Water Experiment

ODL

Colour recognition

In brief: 7 Small plastic cups, Paper towels. Food colouring(Red, Yellow and Blue) and water. Place 7 cups in a row, pour water into the 1st, 3rd, 5th, and 7th cup. Make the cups ¾ full. Add 5 drops red food colouring to the 1st and 7th cup. 5 drops Yellow to 3rd cup and 5 drops Blue to the 5th cup. Place 1 half of a rolled paper towel into the 1st cup and the other half into the next cup. Then another paper towel from 2nd and 3rd cup and so on until the 6th and 7th cup. Watch what happens as the water crawls up the paper towel.

Musical Instrument

In brief: 2 paper or plastic cups or 2 paper plates, tape and dry rice.
Let your child decorate the cups or plates. Once they are done, place some dry rice in 1 cup, place the 2nd cup on top and tape the cups together. If you are using paper plates, place the rice on 1 plate, cover with the 2nd plate and tape down the edges.

Repeat patterning

In orief: Using two pieces of paper, draw 6 shapes on each page, ie: square, circle, triangle, star, oval and crescent (moon). Give your child one of the pages and a pair of scissors to cut out the shapes (with assistance) and some glue. Paste the corresponding shape on the other page.

In the garden

ODL:

Drawing and painting

In brief: Provide your child with paper and crayons, let them sit outside and draw what they see in the garden.

Playdough balls and numbers

ODL

Number recognition

In brief Divide 3 sheets of paper into 4 pieces. Write the number 1 on a piece of paper, do this until you have 10 pieces of paper(or higher if your child knows the number). Place the numbers in front of your child. Let your child roll playdough balls and match them to the numbers on the papers, eg: the number 6 and 6 balls of dough.

Playdough: 2 cups flour, 2 tablespoons oil, ½ cup salt, 2 tablespoons cream of Tartar, 1 to 1½ cups boiling water added in increments until it feels just right

Fine Motor Coordination

In brief: Place a big piece of paper on the wall outside in the garden or inside. Draw a picture of a bunnies face or any other animal and allow your child to use their hands to paint the picture using a hand print.
